Overnight Youth Care Counselor - Boys Ranch

The Youth Care Counselor cares for and supervises youth in care in the group home. The Youth Care Counselor must exhibit the intellectual and emotional maturity required to relate to and care for youth who have behavioral issues and difficulty relating to others due to developmental delays, mental health needs and trauma. The position requires respect for and compassionate understanding for the youth in care and the ability to balance the need for nurture and structure in their work with youth. The Youth Care Counselor must have the ability to form and maintain healthy relationships with youth and co-workers, effectively communicate with others, solve problems and regulate their own behavior in all situations. The Youth Care Counselor must maintain a healthy value system, including moral and ethical behavior consistent with the agency's mission and core values.

Home Parents - Waco Campus & Boys Ranch Single Home Parent (Boys Ranch)

FT Position- The couple are under the supervision of the Unit Manager and Campus Administrator and are responsible for the daily supervision of the youth in the home unit. Other areas of responsibilities are: Teaching daily living skills, problem management, team relationships, home unit management, and an up-to date awareness of Methodist Children's Home policies and procedures. High School Diploma or GED, valid drivers license, and clean criminal history.

Benefactor Relations Officer (Houston,TX area)

The Benefactor Relations Officer solicits gifts and cultivates productive relationships that benefit those served by Methodist Children's Home. This individual is supervised by the Director of Benefactor Relations or his/her designee. The Benefactor Relations Officer fulfills department initiatives and, at times, receives assignments from the Director of Benefactor Relations in order to initiate, maintain and solicit charitable contributions, both current and deferred.

The Benefactor Relations Officer meets established fundraising goals and objectives through personal solicitations, speaking events intended to generate contributions, donor visits to cultivate relationships with MCH benefactors and other best-practice fundraising methods.

Cook

The Cook is a member of the Food Services Department and reports to the Food Services Supervisor/Coordinator for the location assigned. The primary areas of responsibility include preparing nutritious and good-tasting meals, demonstrating kitchen skills to youth, and maintaining kitchen for location as assigned. A high school diploma or equivalent is required. Food Handlers certification is required, and previous experience in culinary field is preferred. This employee must be willing to be cross-trained at all locations of the Food Services Department. The Cook must be at least 21 years of age and have a valid Texas Driver's License, an excellent driving record that meets the standards set forth by the liability insurance company and Methodist Children's Home, no criminal history and acceptable references.

NOTE: Methodist Children's Home will request criminal history, driver's license, background inquiries, and pre-employment drug screening on all employees. Initial employment offers and continued employment is contingent upon acceptable results of all inquiries required.
